Hopefully, our swimming sports will go ahead tomorrow because, unfortunately, the weather looks particularly poor in this part of the country. If we can do the Senior Sports we will push ahead as this helps sort out the Rural Swimming Sports races too. Every year we have children so nervous they don't want to do the 50m swim but end up blitzing the field in the 25m and we enter them in the 50m race at Rurals.

Should the weather be poor we will make an announcement by 8.00am to postpone. If we do postpone we won't get the chance to use the CHS pool again and will just have to use our school pool, which isn't ideal.


