BOT ELECTIONS!

We have seven parents who have been nominated to run for the Roto-o-Rangi Board of Trustees. As there are only five positions on our Board, we are having an election. Voting papers have already been sent out by the school and you may have received your papers already (if not they aren't far away). Voting closes on Friday 3rd June. We urge every family to have their say so that we get a full representation of the community on our Board.

Just look under About Our School, then BOT Elections on the website. We are also emailing the profiles.

Voting papers can be mailed back to school, or dropped in the special ballot box in the office foyer at school.

HEALTH ALERT

Below is a notice sent out to all schools from the Ministry of Education:

An untreated strep sore throat can lead to a serious but preventable illness - rheumatic fever.

People with the highest risk of getting rheumatic fever are mainly Māori and Pacific children aged 4-19 years who live in Northland, Auckland, **Waikato**, Bay of Plenty, East Coast/Gisborne, Rotorua/ Taupo/Turangi, Hawke's Bay, Hutt Valley or Porirua.

If these children or young people have a sore throat, it should be checked by a doctor or nurse as soon as possible. There are free sore throat clinic services in North Island areas with a high incidence of rheumatic fever.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

The BOT is currently reviewing it's Health and Safety Policies and Procedures to ensure we have kept up with the recent changes in legislation. Two of the policies we are consulting with our community on are attached to this newsletter with an accompanying letter to explain in detail what we would like your feedback on.

One of those policies list numerous procedures, rather than photocopy all of these we will include them on the school website to view. Please take the time to read the policies and help us with your feedback.
