WELCOME BACK

Hopefully everyone had an enjoyable holiday period. The children certainly look refreshed and ready to go. The start of the winter term has certainly let us know we are in the depths of the winter months. Calving looks to be in full swing on most farms.

MĀORI ACHIEVEMENT HUI

On <u>Wednesday 3rd August at 7:00pm</u> (Wed next week) we will host a hui for all parents/whanau of our Māori children. The idea is to korero about the student achievement information collected in the middle of the year, the school's effectiveness in our Māori children and your vision for your children whilst they are at Roto-o-Rangi. Finally we can korero about a future hui to be decided by the people there.

This year, we have over 35% of the children at our school identifying as Māori, so it is particularly important that we hear your perspective. Otherwise that is a lot of our school who may not be learning as best they can.

READING EGGS and STEPS PROGRAMMES EXPLAINED

Mrs Furze and Mr D will be holding an information evening on <u>Wednesday 3rd Aug at 6:00pm</u> in Room 3 to explain two computer based programmes that are having big impacts on student achievement in literacy.
