HOMEWORK

When reading comes home, what do I do? With our Juniors, they will often bring home a book they have already read so that they can develop greater fluency. Don't worry too much if your child makes errors with what they read if the story continues to make sense. We all do that, it is just s adults we don't have anyone following along as we read. Developing the fluency and thinking about what the story is telling us is most important.

With senior they are more likely to read their work silently, so it is asking thinking questions that adults need to do. Not just telling you what happened but ask those thinking questions — why did.....? What would happen if? How would the story change if the main character was ...? What do you think is going to happen now? What have you read that makes you think that will happen? If ... happened, how would that change the story?

These sorts of questions are the reasons we read, to understand the concepts the writer is writing about and to critically think about what we have just read. Much more important than them reading every single word correctly.


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
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
