LAST DAY and FIRST DAY 2018

The official last day of school is Friday 15th December. As has been a tradition at Roto-o-Rangi School for many years now we ask that parents of children with Year 1-5 children keep them at home on the last day so that just our Year 6 students turn up to school.

As a treat for all the extra tasks and responsibilities they undertake in the school over their last 2 years, we like to give them the run of the school, uninterrupted, on our last day (plus there is an all in waterfight between staff and Year 6s). They also do quite a bit of sorting of school resources, cleaning and helping teachers with their classrooms.

It is still an official school day, therefore we cannot require all other students stay home on the last day. We hope that you will continue to support this little tradition that makes Roto-o-Rang, Roto-o-Rangi and just that little bit different to other schools. If your child /ren really do need to come to school because there are no alternatives for them, then of course send them along to school.

Another request for the last day is that all children are picked up between 12 and 12.30pm. This would be greatly appreciated. Cambridge Travel lines will conclude both the Country and Town Bus runs on Thursday 14th Dec. Hence no buses will be running on Friday 15th Dec.

A new tradition we would like to begin 2018 with is a Whakatau (modified powhiri), to welcome any new students to the school. One hurdle we discovered is that none of our students have ever been welcomed to Roto-o-Rangi School in this manner; even those who will have been at the school since they turned 5. Hence, all children (and families, if you wish to remain) are invited to be welcomed to the school in this manner. It is a great way of saying, "you are whānau/family'; not just students who come to this school. You mean more than that to us.

Children and adults will come into the school and wait around the area between the archgola and tennis courts. We will hold the whakatau at 9.00am on Wednesday 31st January, 2018.

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




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
