SCHOLASTIC BOOKS

The most efficient way to order the scholastic books is to go Online. Using a credit card you can order the books and get them delivered o school. It costs no more, you can look up the catalogue online too in case you can't remember what to order. That way there is no lost pamphlets, no finding the correct amount of change, no worrying if the order made it to school or not, no worry about lost money. And you can go back to your order to make sure you got it all correct if something ever did go wrong. The first time you do it you need to register. Just follow these steps.

- 1. Go to https://mybookclub.scholastic.co.nz/
- Click on Register and fill in the details: parent's name, your own made up password, email address.
- 3. Add new child for each child in the family
- 4. Search for school (but only enter 'Rot'. A number of schools starting 'Rot' will appear, and Roto-o-Rangi is one. If you enter Roto it doesn't show any schools, which is silly.)
- 5. Choose the class/teacher
- 6. Submit.

You are registered. Then from the main menu, click on 'Order' to start ordering.

You can even do all this from your phone.

The rewards points etc that the school earns still happens, you can still use vouchers if you get them. All the convenience and none of the worry or hassle. Give it a try

TIQBIZ

The school invested in an app called TIQBIZ which allows the school and individual teachers to quickly send messages out to parents

The password when joining a new group is... *Roto3495* (case sensitive + no spaces)

For those new to using the TIQBIZ, you can download the app by:

- 1. Go to the Play Store or Apple Store on your smartphone.
- 2. Search for TIQBIZ
- 3. Download the app (but not the TIQBIZ Admin one.)
- 4. Install and open.
- 5. Register enter your name, NZ, email address, and make up a password.
- 6. Click- Find Boxes then go to Schools, Primary.
- 7. Scroll to Roto-o-Rangi School and select it.
- 8. Tick each group you want messages from i.e. whole school (that's messages from the office), Room?, Rugby, etc. Each time you tap a group you will need to enter the password *Roto3495*.
- 9. Close it. Then find the icon and start using. It even has the school calendar, school website and absence form on it so you can see these things too. There have been a number of messages sent out already this year, so we hope you are getting them.

FORMER ROTO-O-RANGI STUDENT LIVING BY SCHOOL'S MOTO 'AIM HIGH'

This was the headline in the paper last week about Carl Jones and we have added it here too:



Local archer Carl Jones has just returned from Trentham and the National Championships 2017, hosted by Archery Zealand. This tournament covered 2 days of field archery, and 3 days of target archery, and an annual event that hosts our top New Zealand and international archers.

Jones, aged 18 came away with 3 gold medals. First in Field; First in Target; and First in the knockout match play for target. During this National event Jones qualified for the field world championships to be held in France; in September 2017. But Jones has set his goal for 2017 to qualify and compete in the Youth World Target Championships, to be held in Argentina, in October 2017.



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
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
