
School families will be charged \$45 for the 20 weeks they can use the pool. Other local families will pay \$50.

# **BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL CARE**

Just a little reminder that BSC and ASC operate from **7.30am – 8.30am** and then from **3.15pm – 5.30pm**. #### **2019 MLA Homestay Placements Required**

Roto-o-Rangi School is one of the Cambridge Fusion cluster of schools which has been developing Mandarin learning from Year 3 right through to High School, and in 2019 will have Mandarin offered at NCEA Level 1 for the very first time ever.

As part of Cambridge Fusion we have been able to have Mandarin Language Assistants (MLAs – postgraduate university students who are training to become teachers of English in China. They go through an intensive process to be selected for the MLA programme, including police vetting). In 2019 there will be 2 MLAs supporting us and the other Cambridge Fusion schools.

We are looking for two long-term homestay placements for these young student teachers from Friday 1 February, 2019 to the end of Term 4, 2019. Fees of \$250.00 per week will be paid to homestay hosts to cover expenses. 
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




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
