DIGITAL SAFETY EXPERT'S VISIT

Renowned internet risk and safety expert, John Parsons, will explain the skills and knowledge necessary to keep our children/teens safe in <u>their</u> digital world.

The children are hearing the age appropriate messages from John with the Kaipaki children at Kaipaki School. We will be transporting them to and from Kaipaki on the school bus. All children, from New Entrants to Year 6 will be going. Year 4-6 will be there for 10-11 lesson whilst Year 1-3 will be there for a 11.15 – 12.15 lesson.

The day is followed by a staff meeting for all our teachers to keep the school digital environment safe.

In the evenings there are parent meetings. John will explain the skills and knowledge necessary to keep our

children/teens safe in <u>their</u> digital world. If you have teenagers, then John will deliver a very important message about what children of this age are doing and how you can support them. This conversation is delivered at the Middle School meeting, whereas the other ones are more aimed at primary aged/beginning teen aged children.

Attending the parent session with friends and family is effective as you can compare what you heard and share ideas. So get a group together and attend.

Parents in the past have been very enthusiastic about the strategies they have learnt from these sessions.

DIGITAL COMMUNICATION

The Facebook page with the most relevant / time sensitive information about school events and happenings is up and running – The Roto Parents facebook page.

This closed group – so only people we allow to see the page can – is getting out that information about the day to day notices and info, so the whole world can't see it.

We are also trialling a free app you can get on you phone. This is called **Skool Loop** and can be downloaded from you Store (Apple and Android). It allows us to push out notices direct to your phone, syncs your online calendar with the school one so you can plan around school events, has the newsletter, email absentees, and we are even working on digital permission forms for events. It is ¾ operational, so download the app and stay in close contact.

WHOLE SCHOOL CAMP

BOT NEWS

Welcome to all the families for 2018. We have another great year ahead at the school.

Over the holidays the leaky staffroom was mended and the rest of the perimeter fencing was completed to keep a completely safe environment for all of our children. Our ERO report has not been finalised yet, however the draft they sent did highlight the many good things that go on at Roto. We have asked for some tweaks in their wording and so expect the final report to be out any day now.

Unfortunately due to significant work commitments Jo Curin has had to step down from the BOT. We thank Jo for her years of formal support to the school, first as an integral PTA member and then as BOT member. Now Jo's support will be limited to a mum and parent of the school.

The Board have decided to go through a Selection process to find a parent to replace Jo on the Board, whereby they complete a Needs Analysis of the skills needed to support the Board and then select a person with those skills.

If anyone is interested in joining the Board and want to know more about it you can contact the principal or a current Board member (Marcel, Katy, Graeme or William). If you know you want to join the Board then please write a brief bio of yourself outlining the skills you could bring to the Board. This would support the Board in their selection process, or will be included in the election if one is called for.

As part of this process to find a new Board member, all eligible voters have the right to require the Board to go through a full election process, rather than a selection process. Any parent of a child who wants an election must state this in writing within the next 30 days (or 16th March). If less than 10% of eligible voters seek an election, the Board can continue with a selection process.

REPORTING TO PARENTS

Following the removal of National Standards, by the Labour government, the way we report to parents for the children in Years 1-3 has changed. ALL children will now receive their written reports at the end of Term 2 and Term 4. (Children in Year 1-3 will no longer get their reports around their birthday and half way between.) We are also changing the format of the reports in preparation for the mid year. We will be seeking your input later in this term, so have a think about what you want to be able to see in a report, the things you want to know.

We still have the Settling In report coming home next week.

LIBRARY BOOKS

Damaged and lost library books are blowing out our library budget, hence we now need to charge families for any damaged or lost books that children have borrowed. The amount will be set at \$20. No further books will be able to be borrowed until the charge is paid.
