KEEPING THE SCHOOL UP TO DATE

Could families please remember to keep the school up to date with contact details and where their child is. PLEASE ensure the office is informed. A message left on the office phone can be accessed by all staff so we can find out of a bus change, pick up change, stay at ASC or someone is not coming to school today. This saves a lot of unnecessary chasing of children, making calls and concern that we are countermanding what a parent have organised.




