Recently there was an article in the news about inappropriate parental support at children's sports games. However, at the forefront should be the value of respect: respect for your child, respect for the officials, respect for the opposition, and respect for yourself. If there is ever an issue/behaviour that you have with our children, the opposition team, any officials or coach please remember there is always an official channel for dealing with those issues. 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
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
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
