

We will be holding a Mihi Whakatau in the early afternoon of Friday 2nd August. We would love as many families as possible to be present at that Mihi Whakatau to welcome the students to our country. This will be a very new experience for these children as they will be coming from a city of 9 million people and a school of nearly 2000 students to our little Roto-o-Rangi school.

Following the Mihi Whakatau the Chinese children will do some activities with our students before they head off for the weekend. On the following Monday and the Tuesday, the Chinese students will be joining in our Room 4 and 5 classes to experience the very different education practices in New Zealand compared to the intense China model.

In the future we do hope to host other groups for 2 week periods and with the possibility of the students doing a homestay with our local families during this period. Please give this some thought for the future. Having personally done a homestay in the past with Japanese students I have found it to be an amazing experience that your whaanau will never forget.


