All families are welcome to participate in the whakatau, especially the new families to our school.

HOT FOOD WEDNESDAY

A reminder that during Term 3 the children can bring along food to be warmed up in a pie warmer. It MUST be in a suitable container/wrapper for placing in an oven. Please make sure each wrapping has your the **child's name and room number** written on it, otherwise somebody else might get to eat it. Please **do not send soup, noodles** or other foods that need to be heated in a microwave or have hot water added as these require teacher time to administer and they are at school to teach, not be a food warmer-upper. The senior students organise the pie warmer based food as part of their leadership opportunities.

SCHOOL ACCOUNTS

A reminder that each family has a school account set up which is loaded with an annual school donation (\$60) and photocopy donation (\$40), and any charges for stationery/ uniform etc. that your child/ren have received from the office during the term. Stationery, uniform and town bus fees are *required* to be paid. Please pay these upon receipt of the invoice, or set up an automatic payment to chip away at your account throughout the year.

CHINESE STUDENT EXCHANGE

On Friday 2nd August we will have a group of 13 students from China arriving at the school as part of a cultural exchange. We will be holding a Mihi Whakatau on that day, in the early afternoon. We would love as many families as possible to be present at that Mihi Whakatau to welcome the students to our country.

This will be a very new experience for these children as they will be coming from Shijiazhuang, a city of 9 million people and a school of nearly 2000 students, to our little Roto-o-Rangi school.

Following the Mihi Whakatau the Chinese children will do some activities with our students before they head off for the weekend. On the following Monday and Tuesday the Chinese students will be joining in our Room 5 class to experience the very different education practices in New Zealand compared to the intense China model.

In the future we do hope to host other groups for 2 week periods and with the possibility of the students doing a homestay with our local families during this period. Please give this some thought for the future. Having personally done a homestay in the past with Japanese students I have found it to be an amazing experience that your whaanau will never forget.

SCHOOL BUSES

With lots of new children joining us this term we are close to capacity on our town bus service.
