It's almost the end of Term 3! Our last day will be next Friday, 27th September. We hope you are all able to enjoy some time with family and friends to recharge before a busy final term of 2019. If we're lucky maybe the sun will shine for some of the holidays! We're hoping for some good weather this weekend too, as we are having a Working Bee here at school! MACRON v VOWELS IN MAAORI

In the school newsletter and correspondence you will see that Maaori words are appearing with double vowels. In the past we have use macrons to emphasis the longer vowel sounds in Maaori, however in discussion with Mana Whenua the preference in the Tainui iwi that we use double vowels instead of the macron.

There are words we commonly use that we didn't even know needed macrons, like Maaori, so will look rather unusual for a while as we get used to the double vowels instead.


