It's almost the end of Term 3! Our last day will be next Friday, 27th September. We hope you are all able to enjoy some time with family and friends to recharge before a busy final term of 2019. If we're lucky maybe the sun will shine for some of the holidays! We're hoping for some good weather this weekend too, as we are having a **Working Bee** here at school! This will take place on Saturday morning (21st Sept) starting at 9am. AG DAY 18 OCTOBER

Ag Day / Pet Day is being held on Friday 18th October 2019.





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
