WELCOME

TEACHERS' UNION MEETINGS

On Tuesday 19th March the Primary Teachers' Union will be holding meetings, which every union member is entitled to attend. Our teachers will be attending a meeting. It is up to the BOT if the school is to remain open or not during the afternoon and that decision will be made next week.

It is unfortunate that these negotiations have dragged on since July 2018 but the main issues around giving teachers the time they need and the principals the time needed to Lead a school, adequately resourcing children who need extra support in the classroom and addressing workload issues still have not been addressed.

Whilst the Minister of Education supports our claims around these issues, it is the money men in the government who are saying No Deal.

Our hope is that at these meetings there will have been a breakthrough and we will be voting to accept the government's offer, not a call for further industrial action.

FACEBOOK PAGE & PARENT GROUP

Just a reminder that there are 4 main sources of information sharing from the school – Facebook, Skool Loop App, School website, and newsletter.

We have a closed Facebook page called Roto Parents. This allows us to show photos, events, timetables, upcoming events etc that only the school parents need to know about (i.e. like the Miniball times on a Friday, a photo of something fab happening in Room 3, etc.) Anybody wanting access to this page needs to request access through their facebook page and then we will verify the request is a school parent.

The website has loads of general information about school and has the school online calendar very visible. This calendar is the most accurate calendar in the school because it is so regularly updated and used by staff.

The skool Loop app will also give latest information, has the online calendar and all this is located on your phone.

BOT NEWS

Welcome to all the families for 2019. We have another great year ahead at the school.

In May, all of NZ will be holding BOT elections, and we are likely to have 2 positions available on the Roto BOT for 2019 and onwards for 3 years.

SETTLING IN REPORT

We have the Settling In report coming home next week. This is just a highlight of how well your child has settled into the routines of their classroom and their focus on their learning so far.

LIBRARY

Mrs Morris is in charge of the library as well as numerous other roles in the school. She would so appreciate some support in the library. If there is a parent with a few hours free to update the children's names on the system, enter some new books, do a bit of clearseal covering and generally tidy the shelves it would help enormously. After that big job is done, if someone is available for 1 hr a fortnight or so just to keep everything tidied up.

Damaged and lost library books are blowing out our library budget, hence we now charge families for any badly damaged or lost books that children have borrowed. The amount will be set at \$20. No further books will be able to be borrowed until the charge is paid.

PUPPET PERFORMANCE

We are fortunate enough to have a visiting puppet show coming to perform at the school on Tuesday 26^{th} Feb from 12.30pm. The puppet show tells the story of Te Rereka – a bird. This is a Māori story with ties to rock art found in the South Island.

Following the performance the Year 5/6 students will also do a puppeteering workshop where they will learn some techniques before trying to put on their own performance. Thanks to the Waipa DC for funding the performance. For a minor cost to the school we have added on the workshop for our senior class.

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
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
