SWIMMING SPORTS

The Roto Swimming Sports are on next Thursday, March 7th. The programme starts at 10am in the indoor pool as the Juniors and non-confident swimmers show us what they have been learning to do in their swimming lessons. It is fantastic to see how they grow from gaining confidence to put their face in the water, through to diving underwater and onto confidently swimming. Then we venture to the outside pool to watch the competitive levels of confident swimmers. Here we have races based on age, but also the Cup Races for any child to compete in races against all ages in order to be crowned the fastest swimmer at Roto-o-Rangi School.

Whilst relaxed, this is a fun and competitive day which mixes resilience (giving something your best shot) with excellence (striving to be the best). Parents are welcome to join us for all or part of the day. Most of the serious competition races are completed by lunch at 12.30pm and then there are the relays, fun races and free swim to conclude after lunch.

Last year the parents and students gave the teachers a whooping in the Teachers v Parents v Children race and the teachers are seeking revenge so the parents better make sure they bring their togs to keep their title!

At the end of March it is the Rural Schools' Swimming Sports back at St Peter's and our whole school attends. The organising school needs quite a few parents to help with place-getting, timekeeping, etc, so please help out if you can.

DONATIONS TO OUR SCHOOL

The Skool Loop app will also give latest information and the online calendar, and all this can be viewed to your phone.

We have just added the ability to complete permission forms through the app; especially handy when that pesky bag monster eats the paper version your child was supposed to bring home! Fill out the form on your phone, use your finger to sign it and you completed the permission. The Triathlon permission form is currently on the app.

SCHOOL ACCOUNTS

The up to date school accounts will soon be ready to send out to parents & caregivers. Each one will have added; School Donation \$60, Photocopy Levy \$40 per child, and Stationery Costs as per the items required by each individual child at the start of the term. If your child attends Before/After School Care this will also be added, as will the cost of the Town Bus (\$30 per term) if relevant. All payments made to your account will also be detailed.

The school is carrying a large debt from those families who have not settled previous accounts, and so we would appreciate these being settled quickly in 2019.

We welcome the setting up of Automatic Payments to chip away at your account throughout the year – it's much easier than being faced with a big bill later on!

TE PUNA O KEMURETI

Our school is a part of a Community Of Learners – 11 schools and 4 ECE centres in Cambridge - working on developing a better learning pathway from Early Childhood through to High School for Cambridge students. Over the last couple of years, the foundations have been laid and now the schools are developing those pathways. Two key areas the TPoK community have been developing are Learner Agency and Culturally Responsive Practice – the same as Roto-o-Rangi School.
