LOCAL STORIES TRIP BACK ON

Just as lockdown came in to force we were about to visit the local sites of importance around Cambridge, pre-European settlement. This was going to be part of our whole school camp, however we postponed it. Thankfully we have been able to try again, albeit in a more challenging time.

Harry Wilson is mana whenua and has supported our school in numerous ways, and again he is supporting us by coming on the trip to explain the events and times at the sites we are visiting – Lake Te Ko Utu, Lake Karapiro and Rangiaowhia. To fit in with timing and other plans, we have chosen to do this trip on Wednesday 17th June, which is not far away. A detailed itinerary and permission form will come home tomorrow. This is all based on the assumption we will be in Level 1, but believe it is still safe even at Level 2 for a school setting. Cambridge Travel Lines will be supplying buses so there will be a cost for this trip.
