WELCOME BACK TO TERM 3

VALUES VAULT

Manaakitia/Caring is one of the values we have which is easy to show when someone is hurt but not always shown in other ways.

Here are some simple ways of helping their Manaakitia:

Create a Kindness Project

Devise an activity where your family records ONE act of kindness or ONE pleasant activity per day. You might call it your "Kindness Project" or "Happiness Diary." These activities could include helping with dishes, letting someone else go first, taking care of an animal, going out of way the for a friend, hugging someone to make them feel better, etc.

Gratitude

Being grateful for what you have leads to Caring for others. At dinner time, sit down to a meal together and talk about one thing you are grateful for today.

Doing "with"

Encourage children not just to "do for" others but to "do with" others, working with diverse groups of students to respond to community problems.

WATERBLASTING



- 5. Swap plastic utensils for stainless steel, BPA free plastic or bamboo cutlery.
- Swap pre-packaged yoghurt tubs for reusable stainless steel or BPA free plastic containers.
