ROTO SPEECH FINALS

Are still going ahead tonight, however, due to Level 2 requirements, we will be restricting numbers attending. Only parents and siblings at Roto-o-Rangi School will be able to accompany the "orator" (the child presenting their speech). Siblings under 5 and over 11 (at CMS or High School) cannot attend. Physical distancing in the MP Room will be required as will signing in on the Contract Tracing Register. Once we are in the MP Room each family will have to sit together and stay together, friends will not be able to mix and play on the night. Hand sanitiser will be available and everyone will sanitise or wash hands upon entry to the MP Room.

The top orator in the Yr 5/6 group then competes in the Cambridge Schools' Rotary Speech Competition on Wednesday 16th September.

ROTO CROSS COUNTRY

A reminder that our cross country event is tomorrow, across the road at the Wallis Farm. **Races begin at 12.45pm.** Because of Level 2 requirements we will need your cooperation to adhere to the following;

- Maximum of **two** spectators per family, who must be either parents/caregivers or grandparents.
- Spectators must register at the gate using either the contact tracing QR code or sign-in sheet. Our preference is the QR code. There will be hand sanitiser at the gate for spectators to use.
- There will be a section of the farm where **all** spectators must watch the event from; this is inside the paddock directly behind where the school sits. No standing on the track/driveway side of the fence, no standing in the paddocks/areas on the quarry side of the driveway/track.
- The students and adults are **not** to mix, as all adults not known to a child must maintain a 2 metre distance from them.
