#### **BOT VACANCY**

We have a vacant position on our BOT. If you would be interested in being considered for the position please contact the principal for any extra information, and the skills you would bring to the BOT.

So what does being a BOT Member mean?

The BOT's job is to see that everything that needs to be done gets done - legally, ethically, and as well as possible in the best interests of its students.

It is also the employer of all staff, including the principal, and sets the overall strategic direction for the school or kura. The principal is the board's 'chief executive' and manages the school or kura in line with the board's direction and policies.

Every board member brings their own unique set of skills and experiences to the board.

As a member of your school's board, you will need to work well in a team and have good communication skills. You may have financial skills and experience in managing people, knowledge and understanding of particular communities within your school, or experience working within your school and wider communities. School boards need to represent the diversity of their school communities to ensure a bright future for all our children. So, your background, whatever that is, could be the very thing this BOT is missing.

The Winter Sports season is upon us and the children are now training with their new clubs, with their first games of netball and rugby coming up in the next week or so.

Please let us know about your experiences with the new club system so we can feed it back to the clubs to help them. 


