HOT FOOD WEDNESDAY 'RULES'

On **Wednesdays** students have the option to bring in a lunch that can be heated up by staff and senior students. Please note the following requirements;

- Clearly write the child's name and room number
- Packaging/containers able to be heated in the oven as they are. i.e. Wrapped in heatable wrapping – tinfoil, paper; But <u>NOT</u> Ziplock bags, sistema type plastic containers, clingwrap or anything that can't go directly in the oven.
- 2min noodles are NOT allowed.

Examples include; pie, sausage, toastie, pizza slices.

BOT VACANCY

As part of the process for filling the vacancy on the BOT there is a survey to be conducted. The position can be filled by either 1/. A by-election (calling for nominations and all families voting) or 2/. Selection (parents put their names forward and the BOT select a person with the skills and knowledge they need on the Board).

BOT NEWS

Over the last few BOT meeting there has been discussion about the levels of aggressive behaviour in the school and the steps the school has taken to address these. Whilst numerous strategies have been utilised, they have not had the desired effect.

This week, both the MOE and the RTLB (Resource Teachers for Learning and Behaviour) have visited the staff to investigate what is happening and to implement different strategies to tackle the issues.

Besides focussing on the individuals concerned, the MOE wish to implement a whole school strategy. This is on top of the extra teacher aide hours/the extra supervision/the various behaviour strategies already in place and the outside support that the school teachers have already used.

The school has asked for this support to be a top priority, and so the MOE are doing a whole day's training with the staff, this term. They have finally seen the need to act quickly. So, we will be having a Teacher Only Day on Monday June 28th to do their training.

Whilst we understand how difficult on families this term is now that we have 3 Teacher Only Days dotted over the remaining weeks, this one had to be added to address the behavioural concerns.

LAUNCHPAD (Bible In Schools)

Lessons will run until the end of the term. They are held in the MP Room from 11.50 - 12.20. The theme of the lessons will be based on Elijah and the Values: respect, integrity, community, equity and participation.

MATARIKI HANGI

To celebrate Matariki at the end of the term (it will be a national holiday in 2022) we are holding a traditional hangi on Friday 2nd July in the evening here at school. Thank you to the parents organising the Fry Bread, some of the PTA helping with serving up the meals AND the parents who are supplying all the hangi gear and laying the hangi. Costs and order forms will come home soon.



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
