ERO VISITING

The education review Office is starting their partnership with the school. For those who have had children in schools for years, ERO used to come in every few years and check that schools were fulfilling their obligations. Whilst they are still fulfilling this requirement, now they do it throughout each and every year. They are visiting for the first time in a couple of weeks and will be observing what is happening in the classrooms. At some stage in the future they will be wanting feedback from parents too, but not at this stage.

HEALTH CURRICULUM MEETING

Every 2 years the school is required to consult the community on our Health Curriculum. This often causes some concerns with parents as they believe the curriculum can encroach on areas that are the sole responsibility of the parents. Hence we will hold a kanohi ki te kanohi/face to face meeting at school on Thursday August 25th at 6.30pm to outline the curriculum we are proposing to hold over the next 2 years, and seek input from the community about things they would like included.

TIKANGA TANTALIZERS

There are some simple tikanga protocols we follow at school, which people may not be aware of. It does not mean we expect children to do these in their own family environments but it is good for them to be aware of these things because they could be in environments where it is important to know them.

 New children in our school are always welcomed by a class whakatau. The class will do a mihi (welcome), say the school pepeha, sing a waiata of welcome and do a karakia. We want parents to be a part of that too, so they are welcomed and made a part of the class and school.

We do a whole school whakatau at the start of the year to also welcome a new year.

- 2. We don't tap children on the head, sit on tables/benches/pillows we sleep on or step over each. The head is sacred / important and should be respected. Our backsides should not be anywhere near them hence not stepping over children and not sitting on places where we eat from/work/sleep.
- Removing shoes in the MP Room. As it is like our wharenui, you don't bring the dirt from the outside, inside. So when you see Mr D doing assembly in his socks, you will know why.
- 4. All children learn their pepeha. Knowing where you come from, so when meeting new people you can make more of a connection with you and your family makes that relationship more personal.
