ROTO ATHLETICS

In a couple of weeks, **Tues 15th Nov**, we will be holding our Roto Athletics Day. The programme has already been sent out. The basic plan for the day is field events in the morning - discus/quoit throwing, shot putt, long jump, high jump and vortex throw. The children will move from 1 field event to the next each ½ hr. In the afternoon there are the running races. Each age group will do 2 sprints, the 2nd slightly further than the first. The day finishes with the House relay.

We also have the Athletics Cups - a 100m sprint and a 400m race. This is another great opportunity for the children to dress up in their house colours, colour their hair and do some face painting.

PB4L

Our reasoning is:

to help create an environment where everyone can experience a sense of belonging/Tuurangawaewae. We will do this through modelling, teaching, learning and rewarding positive behaviours to enhance our relationships. When children feel safe and connected, our learning can flourish.

This form has 2 sections.

Section 1 - these are the broad behaviours we believe typify the Value associated with them. If all people (children, staff, parents, visitors, etc.) use these behaviours all the time, then our kura will be an awesome place to be.

We are asking if parents agree with the 4-5 broad behaviours we will promote as being important. We only want 4-5 broad behaviours otherwise the children (and adults) won't remember them. You can add suggestions too.

Section 2 - the unacceptable behaviours are being split into 2 categories Major Behaviour and Minor Behaviour. We would like parents to indicate if the listed behaviours are in the categories they believe they should be in, if not what would you change and if any other behaviours need to be added. Some of the behaviours are very specific and others are broad (which will be made more specific in the future).

You won't see 'bullying' listed because bullying is made up of numerous behaviours, so these behaviours are listed in their own right.

It will only take 5 mins to complete but will give the PB4L Lead Team great support to know we are all moving in the same direction.

HATS HATS HATS

Term 4 is skin cancer term, so to prevent the children getting it, we return to hat wearing to play in the playground. Wide brimmed hats like bucket hats or cricket hats are required, caps are not acceptable. We have school bucket hats for sale at \$15.

MANA WHENUA UPDATE

Mana whenua are concerned about the section of highway between Cambridge and Pairere. They met with Waka Kotahi Regional Directors as part of a Governance relationship with them to advocate the urgency to upgrade road safety on this section.

Waka Kotahi have started:

- 1) legal process & signage regarding temporary speed reduction from 100 80km.
- 2) consultation with landowners, stakeholder and community regarding the fast tracking of safety improvements ie medium barriers
- 3) Environmental court procedure regarding SHW1 / 29 (Tauranga intersection) now awaiting consent decision and improvement approval.
- 4) The project teams will be holding an Information Day on 17 November 2022 from 1-6.30pm at the Cambridge Town Hall.
