We offer our students the option to bring in a lunch that

can be heated up by staff/senior students. Their lunch has to meet the following requirements in order for a hassle-free heatup and distribution, so please note the following;

- Wrapped in ovenproof wrapping (baking paper, tin foil, paper bag, ovenproof dish).
 Must be able to use in the oven/pie warmer.
- Must be clearly marked with the child's name and room number.
- No Sistema containers, or other plastic containers that will melt when placed in a hot oven
- No 2 minute noodles etc. That need boiling water or to be microwaved.

Examples of suitable foods include; pie, sausage roll, toasties, pizza slices, pasta, samosa, quiche, meatballs, etc. This is purely optional, so if it doesn't work for you and your child/ren please don't feel obliged to do it.

To do this we need to first review our current values by asking our school community how they feel about them. This includes our staff, students, and of course you. 

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
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
